How to Use This Toolkit

This outreach toolkit is designed to provide Learns Local Leads (LLLs) with the resources and guidance needed to effectively encourage school districts in their area to participate in the Early Development Instrument (EDI) data collection for Spring 2026. We know district participation increases significantly if local partners like yourself get involved. A few emails and phone calls can make the difference between excellent, impactful data and an empty map.

Step one: Review the districts in your area that are eligible but have not registered yet (see District Contact Information page)

Step two: Reach out to districts by calling or sending an email (see Talking Points and Email Template) and ask them to consider registering for the EDI this year. Make sure they know they can register by downloading and filling out this form.

Step three: Keep in touch! We are here to support and answer any questions that may come up.

EDI Talking Points

What is the EDI?

- The Early Development Instrument (EDI) is a nationally recognized, population-based measure of early childhood well-being that assesses school readiness.
- The EDI project in Arkansas aims to assess and improve school readiness for kindergarteners. This initiative is supported by the Arkansas Department of Education (ADE) Office of Early Childhood under the guidance of Assistant Commissioner Tonya Williams.

Regional Impact and District Benefits

- EDI data helps districts better understand the developmental needs of their kindergarten students across multiple domains.
- Districts use EDI data for grant applications, school improvement plans, and community initiatives to enhance early childhood services.
- Participating districts contribute to their LEARNS Local Lead catchment area's efforts to build systems that improve early childhood development and opportunities.

Active Participation is Essential

- Active participation from school districts is essential for robust and reliable EDI data and maps.
- More participation means districts get a full-picture view of early childhood development in their counties and a baseline for comparison in future EDI years.

Teacher-Friendly Process

- The EDI questionnaire takes only about 10 minutes per student, with flexible timing in the spring.
- There is zero student testing or technology setup required from teachers.
- Participating kindergarten teachers receive a \$100 incentive gift card.

Unique Purpose

- The EDI provides community-level insights rather than just academic assessment data.
- EDI data informs early childhood resource planning and community partnerships.
- Districts can leverage unique EDI data to strengthen grant applications.

Minimal Resource Impact

- Participation in the EDI is provided at no cost to school districts.
- The process is completed by teachers, not students, requiring minimal oversight.
- Districts only need to participate every 3 years, not annually.
